Free parking available in Noblesville City Hall lot

Noblesville Mayor John Ditslear has announced that the December free parking initiative for the City Hall metered parking lot (Lot 2) has returned again this year. Offered since 2007, this initiative's goal has been

to encourage downtown holiday shopping since the parking lot is located just one block away from the courthouse square. The City Hall public parking lot is located immediately east of City Hall and between Conner and Maple streets.

Members of the Noblesville Street Department have placed covers over all of the meters in this lot and they will remain until the end of 2017. "Each holiday season, we've offered this program as a way to inspire people

to explore the many shops, restaurants and arts venues that downtown Noblesville has to offer. I hope many people will take advantage of free parking in the City Hall lot and help support the local downtown businesses," Ditslear said.

Changes coming to Westfield's Asa Bales Park

Playgrounds at the north and south end of Asa Bales Park will be removed next week in order to prepare the area for new play structures next spring. The play equipment currently located in Asa Bales is nearly 20 years old and is requiring more and more maintenance as time goes on. The city is removing them before they become unsafe for children to play on. The playground on the north end of Asa Bales will be replaced with a more modern

play structure in the spring of 2018. Designs are not yet completed for this area. The playground on the south end of the park will be replaced with a Gaga Ball pit, which is a dodge-ball like game played inside of an octagonal pit. Fishers Arts Council, Ball State architectural students work on indoor arts facility concepts

The City of Fishers does not have an indoor facility for arts events and performances. There are people in the city working to remedy that situation. The Fishers Arts Council has engaged the Ball State University College

of Architecture and Planning to provide concepts for such an arts center. "Fishers is a city of more than 90,000 residents, in one of the wealthiest communities in Indiana, yet it does not have an art gallery or an indoor performing arts facility," said Daniel Kloc, president of the Fishers Arts

Council in a news release. "We asked ourselves: what if we had an arts facility, something that could contain a black box theater and space for visual arts, what would that look like?" Timothy Gray is an Indianapolis architect who teaches at Ball State. He liked the Fishers Arts Council idea,

and included it as part of the curriculum for his studio class. Hope Disbro is a 2015 Hamilton Southeastern High School graduate and is enrolled in Gray's class. "Every time I come back to Fishers there is new stuff,"

HSE board calls special meeting about school calendars

It appears the issue of school calendars in the Hamilton Southeastern District is not over yet. The school board has scheduled a special meeting Wednesday, Nov. 29. Board President Matt Burke says he called the meeting after consulting with HSE Superintendent Allen Bourff and after discussions with a majority of school board members he was able to contact on short notice. Burke says he called the special session to let the community know they "have been heard" by members of the school board. Although he called the special meeting, Burke added that he does not know what the result would be if a school calendar reconsideration vote is taken. The published agenda for the Nov. 29 meeting says the board "will consider taking action"



It's package theft season, be careful

As the holidays get closer, package delivery tends to increase. This usually brings an increase in thefts of delivered packages from homes that are left by delivery services. Here are some tips offered by the Noblesville Police Department (NPD) to help you prevent being a victim:

- Consider having the package delivered to a

family member or neighbor who will be at home for the delivery.

- Consider having the package delivered to you at work.

- Consider having the package set for pick-up at the shipping facility.

- Consider requiring a signature for delivery. (After a few attempts, this may mean you have to pick up the package at a shipping facility.)

- Packages sent via USPS can be picked up at your local post office. UPS packages can be picked up at your local UPS store. The Noblesville U.S. Post Office is at 1900 Pleasant St. UPS Stores are at 176 Logan St. (near Kroger) and 14350 Mundy Drive (near State Road 37 and 146th Street).

- Amazon provides a service that allows deliv-

ery drivers access to your home long enough to put the package inside. This requires purchase of a camera and door lock.

- Install video cameras showing your front porch. This may not prevent a theft but would provide video of the suspect.

If you are the victim of a theft of your delivered package, call NPD to report the theft at (317) 773-1300.



No emergency siren tests after Friday until spring

Weekly testing of Hamilton County's outdoor emergency warning sirens will be suspended for the winter following the regular 11 a.m. test on Friday, Nov. 24.

Officials suspend tests during winter cold weather to prevent possible damage to the sirens from moisture freezing inside the mechanisms. Hamilton County Emergency Management will resume regular weekly tests of the

sirens in the spring when temperatures permit.

While Hamilton County Emergency Management officials test and activate the outdoor warning sirens, the sirens are owned and maintained by area cities and towns. Even though testing is suspended, sirens are not turned off and communications tests are performed daily to ensure each siren is operational. In the case of an emergency, sirens are available for activation throughout the year.

Prepare your garden for winter without cutting

Many gardeners choose to cut their plants down in the autumn months, but there are important benefits to allowing plants and flowers to remain in place during the winter.

One benefit is that dried seed heads provide food for birds during the

cold weather months. In addition, dead plants provide a habitat for beneficial insects to hibernate and lay eggs throughout the winter, which is called overwintering. Gardeners who help beneficial insects during the winter will then be helped by those insects during the summer and enjoy a

healthier garden.

Gardeners who choose to remove the plant growth in the spring should wait until after several 50-degree days have passed before clearing their garden to prepare for planting. This will allow overwintering beneficial insects to survive and safely leave

the plants.

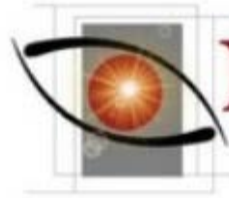
In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Homer Lewis; and grandson, Chad White.

Boys basketball

Junior Millers step up to victory in opener

It's a natural progression of a high school basketball player's career: Last year on the junior varsity, this year on the varsity.

A group of juniors are making that jump for the Noblesville boys basketball team this season. That group played its first varsity game Wednesday night and handled the transition well: The Millers had a great defensive effort during its 62-38 win over Indianapolis Northwest at The Mill.

The new group is stepping in after Noblesville graduated a large contingent of seniors from last season. There are three returning players back from last year's varsity list: Senior Ryan Barnes and junior Xavier Hines were regulars for the Millers last year, and Zack Johnson got into a couple varsity games last season as well.

"We're not necessarily young in the sense that juniors aren't really young," said Noblesville coach Brian McCauley, who started his fourth season as the Millers' coach Wednesday night. "We're kind of inexperienced. Good senior leadership from Ryan Barnes and Riley Vitales. The core of our group is our juniors."

Hines, a 6-3 guard, scored seven of Noblesville's first nine points of the game, with Barnes, a 6-5 forward, getting the other two points with a layin. One of Hines' baskets was a 3-pointer.

The Millers led 13-8 at the end of the first quarter. Noblesville then ramped up its defense in the second period, allowing the Space Pioneers just three points. That allowed the Millers to take a 23-11 lead into the locker room at halftime. Johnson scored the half's last five points, on two free throws and a three-point play.

"We want to hang our hat on our defense, as most teams do," said McCauley. "And we feel that if we can be a good defensive team, then you got a chance to be successful."

Noblesville continued to roll through the second half. The Millers outscored Northwest in each quarter, including 17-11 for the third period. Hines made his second 3-pointer of the game in that quarter.

In the fourth quarter, Noblesville added 22 more points. Jaron Youree, a 5-11 junior guard, led the way with seven points. Youree drained two 3-pointers in that period, giving him three triples for the night (he made one in the second period). Johnson added six more points.

Huskies drop opener to Lebanon

Hamilton Heights' boys team lost its season-opener on Wednesday night, falling to Lebanon 52-43 at the Husky Dome.

The Tigers led 12-11 after the first quarter and 22-17 at halftime. The Huskies stayed close during the second half, but Lebanon outscored Heights 17-13 in the fourth quarter to seal the win.

"The Husky girls had a great night taking first places in every event but one," said Heights coach Sue Beale.

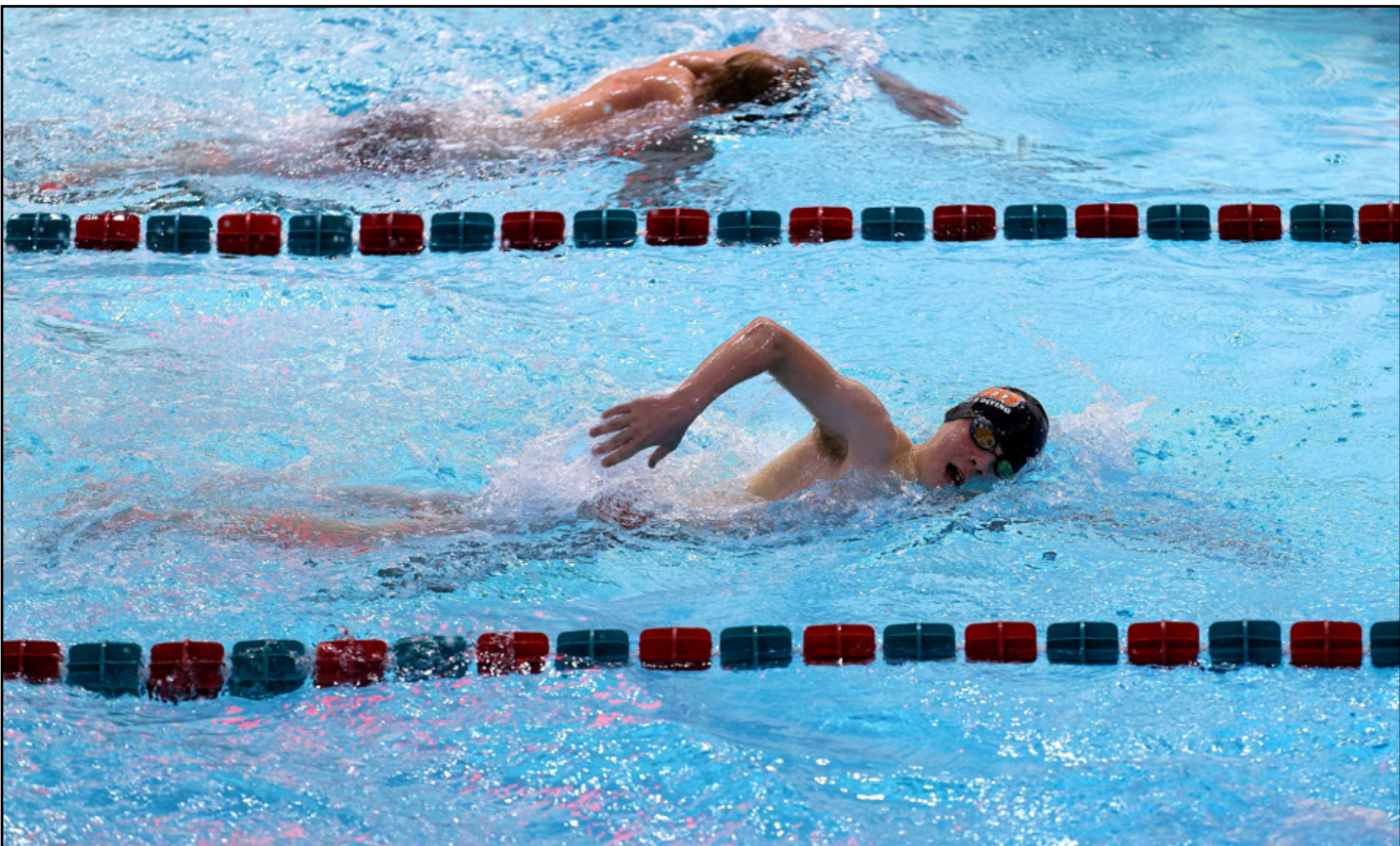

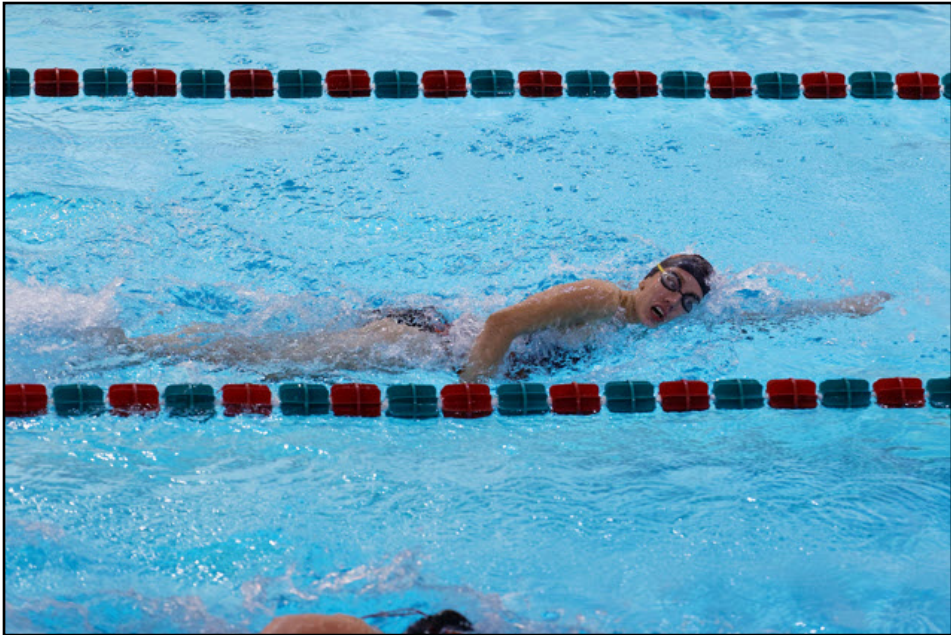
Lee Martin won the diving event with the score of 180.55.
