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# Sharp says sign ordinance violates free political speech . . . **Candidate sues county commissioners**

Rick Sharp, a former Carmel Council president and current candidate for an atlarge seat on the Hamilton County Council, has filed a lawsuit in Hamilton County Superior Court 3 alleging a new ordinance passed by county commissioners violates his First Amendment right to free political speech.

Earlier this month, Hamilton County

Commissioners unanimously passed an ordinance prohibiting the placement of signs in county-owned public right-of-ways. Commissioners cited public safety as the reason for the ordinance. Commissioners say placing signs in public right-of-ways makes it difficult for motorists to recognize regulatory signs which are necessary for safe travel and often block the vision of motorists

at intersections

In his complaint Sharp says the commissioners make no showing of any public safety necessity and, even if they could, any alleged public safety concern does not outweigh the United States Constitution's First Amendment right of free political speech enough to allow commissioners to restrict or regulate political speech.

Sharp alleges he would suffer irreparable harm should the court not grant injunctive relief prohibiting the enforcement of the ordinance.

Sharp is asking Judge William Hughes to declare the ordinance void and to award him costs, expenses and attorney fees.

Sharp is represented by Westfield attorney Timothy Stoesz.

# Westfield homicide suspect sentenced

Last Thursday, Hamilton County Superior Court 1 Judge Steven Nation sentenced Joseph Coccaro to nine years in prison for Coccaro's involvement in the 2016 Westfield homicide of Corey Zimmer.

Zimmer was found beaten to death in a parking lot of an apartment building just east of the Kroger grocery store located near State Road 32 and Carey Road.

Coccaro's sentence came after pleading guilty in December to aggravated battery

## Noblesville cuts ribbon at transportation center

Noblesville Schools officially cut the ribbon last Friday on their newly-constructed transportation center at a public dedication event. The new center is located at 19790 Hague Road adjacent to West Middle School and replaces the previous location on Field Drive near Noblesville High School.

"Our former transportation center was built in 1978 when Noblesville Schools approximately served 4,000 students and couldn't provide the space we need today to serve over 10,000 students," said Beth Niedermeyer, superintendent of Noblesville Schools. "Our

## INDOT awards contract to build Strawtown Avenue roundabout, restore bridge on State Road 37

The Indiana Department of Transportation has awarded Beaty Construction Inc. a \$1.6 million contract to build a roundabout at State Road 37 and Strawtown Avenue and begin work on a bridge deck overlay on SR 37 over the White River in

Strawtown, northeast of Noblesville.

The overlay on the SR 37 bridge over the White River will seal the deck against moisture intrusion and deterioration. At the same time, it restores the bridge's driving surface for a smoother, safer ride.

Strawtown Avenue will be closed for up to 90 days. Detour signs will direct traffic around the construction site via Madison Street, SR 37, 216th Street, Victory Chapel Road and Craig Avenue.

SR 37 will be restricted up to 90 days. A temporary traffic signal will be installed to regulate both directions of traffic sharing one lane in the work zone.

A start date will be announced after a project schedule has been submitted by contractors. Strawtown Avenue and SR 37 will be fully open to traffic in fall 2018.

Coccaro's attorney argued for Coccaro to be sentenced to work release. Miksha responded by stating, "You shouldn't trust the defendant. He has a history of probation and parole violations."

Miksha also noted Coccaro had previously been convicted of theft and narcotics possession.

Coccaro's accomplice, Shakka Brogden, was recently found guilty during a jury trial. Brogden is scheduled to be sentenced in March.

## Second bond financing Geist Park in Fishers gets approval

a \$5 million bond to finance the purchase of land for a new city park located on Geist Reservoir's waterfront. The only dissenting vote came from Councilwoman Selina Stoller, who also voted "no" on the bond at the City Council Finance Committee's last meeting.

A \$12 million bond is currently in place, but the eminent domain process has valued the land roughly \$6 million more than the city's offer to purchase the parcel from IMI Incorporated. That required the additional bond to complete the purchase through the state's condemnation process.

Council President Todd Zimmerman allowed public comment before the vote. Former Fishers Town Councilman Mike Colby and former Democratic Council candidate Greg Purvis both spoke against

After Cliff Hackman, Assistant Principal, and Hamilton Heights Primary School and HHSC School Safety Coordinator, fielded a number of calls from parents expressing concerns and anxiety related to the school shooting in Parkland, Fla., he had an idea. With the monthly fire drill Hackman approaching, wanted to take advantage of a teachable moment.

While the school setting remains one of the safest and most secure places for students, Hackman understands the concerns. He reached out to the local fire departments to see if they would like to participate in Heights regularly scheduled monthly fire drill. They were more than happy to help and arrived in force last Friday.

Personnel from Jackson Township Fire Department and the Cicero Fire Department were excited to be present at the fire drills, interact with students throughout and provide a little safety education while they were there. Members

of the media were there to capture the moment and help share the message about how one rural district continues its proactive safety efforts in the wake of a national tragedy.

Personnel in uniforms are a familiar sight for students at Hamilton Heights who have active and engaged School Resource Officers (SRO) at each of the four buildings. Local fire and emergency personnel are familiar and welcome sights. The local departments often bring equipment and personnel to the schools throughout the year for special educational and safety awareness programs and career days.

Josh Ireland, a member of the Hamilton County Sheriff's Department, a SRO at the Primary and Elementary Schools, said the safety of students and personnel is first and foremost. "When it comes to these monthly drills, we have it down to a science," said Deputy Ireland. "Even our youngest students know the procedure. We have our entire population out of

the building, checked and cleared for re-entry in a matter of minutes. "Today was a treat because of the presence of the various first responders, emergency and fire personnel."

While these young

students may not be aware of the conversations and stories taking place at the national level regarding safety, we are pleased to take a proactive stance in working with our local school schools on situational awareness education and training," said Jackson Township Fire Department Chief, Jeff Muszar. "In addition, our department in cooperation with the Cicero Fire Department along with the

on-site SRO's are planning future cooperative training events involving multiple public safety agencies to coordinate responses to school emergencies."

The seven members Board of Trustees of the Sheridan Public Library had their annual election of officers at the January meeting. Loretta Sutherland was elected president, Jill Bishop is the vice president, Barb Hybarger is the secretary and Katie Will is the treasurer. In addition, Lisa Samuels, John Vincent and Matt Lenseigne are non-office holding members.

The seven members of the board are appointed for a four-year term by different agencies. According to library director Steve Martin, "There are different appointing authorities for libraries comprised of towns, townships, counties and cities. The Sheridan Public Library is a township library (Adams Township) and as such we have board members appointed by five separate political bodies. Sheridan Community Schools appoints three members to the board: Lisa Samuels, Barb Hybarger and Jill Bishop. The Sheridan Town Council appoints one member, John Vincent. The Adams Township Trustee appoints one member, Matt Lenseigne. The Hamilton County Commissioners have one appointment, Katie Will. And the Hamilton County Council appoints one member, Loretta Sutherland."

Martin says that four years ago the library board began an association with the Purdue Extension service ACTS (A Chance To Serve) program which gives high school freshmen

an opportunity to serve on a not-for-profit community board. This year the Sheridan board welcomes Sheridan High freshman Baylee Murray to the board for a one year term. This is a non-appointed, volunteer, non-voting associate position. In addition, the library director also serves as a non-voting member of the board.

In Indiana a public library board appointment is a four-year commitment, and no more than four consecutive terms, or a total of 16 years, may be served. Persons interested in serving on the Sheridan Library Board are encouraged to contact library director Steve Martin for further information, or they may directly contact the appointing authorities listed above.



# Carmel cop honored for saving life

On June 20, 2017, Carmel Police Officer Tony Lovitt was on patrol when he received notification from Hamilton County Communications Center dispatcher Jill Jones of an unconscious male in the area of Bayhill Drive and Sugar Cay Court.

Officer Lovitt responded and, upon arriving on the scene, he observed a good Samaritan, Bill Schlies, performing CPR on the unconscious male who was later identified as Jeff Utzinger. Officer Lovitt immediately retrieved his automated external defibrillator (AED) and attached the instrument to Utzinger. The AED delivered one shock to Utzinger.

Also arriving at the scene was Sergeant Brady Myers. Myers assisted Schlies and Lovitt by performing chest compressions on Utzinger until Carmel Fire Department personnel arrived.

Officer Lovitt was recently honored for his quick and effective response along with Sgt. Myers for

immediately retrieved his his assistance with chest automated external defibril- compressions.

The Carmel Police Department stated the officers' quick actions resulted in Utzinger being revived on the scene and transported to the hospital for further care.

Following the incident Officer Lovitt maintained contact with a family member and sought updates on Utzinger. Later, Utzinger and his family then met with Lovitt. The meeting was described very emotional as Utzinger thanked Officer Lovitt for his quick actions that played an integral part in saving his life.

Jeff Utzinger is married with three young children and as a result of these first responders they will have their father for many more years.

# Native plant kits, rain barrels available

#### The RERPORTER

Spring is coming, so plan ahead for your landscape needs by ordering your native plants and rain barrels from the Hamilton County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD). The SWCD has all you need to conserve water and support pollinators like bees and butterflies with beautiful native plants.

Native plant kits allow you to take the guesswork out of plant selection by providing a set of plants that will be perfect for your yard. Each native plant kit contains 50 native plant plugs for \$120. There is a kit for any area of your landscape including pollinator garden, rain garden (for wetter areas), and shade garden. Each kit contains 10 different perennial species of native plants and can fill a space 50 to 150 square feet.

Rain barrels are also available for pre-order for \$75. These repurposed barrels capture rainwater from your downspout and roof and hold it for your use at a later time. Rain barrel water is great for watering plants and gardens or even washing the car. In peak summer months, a rain barrel can save around 1,300 gallons of free, naturally soft water for your use. Pre-pay for your barrel and choose between grey, terra cotta and black 55-gallon rain barrels. Diverters systems for easily installation are also available for \$25.

Plant kit and rain barrel pre-orders can be placed online at hamiltonswcd. org or by visiting the SWCD office at 1717 Pleasant St., Noblesville. Orders and payment are due by Monday, April 16. The plant kits and barrels will be available for pick up on Friday, May 11 in Noblesville – right in time for Mother's Day. All proceeds support conservation projects and education in Hamilton County.

and bus routes have been running from there since school resumed following winter break.

"With almost 200 different routes, our 100+ buses and drivers travel approximately 1.2 million miles each year safely transporting 9,300 students a day to 10 school buildings and locations as far away as Downtown Indy and Beech Grove," added Niedermeyer. "The work they do is an important part of supporting students. We're also proud that our transportation mechanics have had a perfect safety inspection rate for 31 consecutive years."

The new transportation center location was chosen because of its accessibility for bus routes and its infrastructure design. It was also a cost savings for the district because they already owned the land. The location next to West Middle School will also help address the parking shortage at that school, providing West event visitors additional parking options.

The design was crafted with the community in mind, incorporating a maximum set-back off the road and landscaping buffers to address any sight or noise

concerns from neighbors. Traffic impact was explored with the City of Noblesville and the Indiana Department of Transportation with no noted concerns.

The \$10.5 million cost of the construction project was financed through construction bonds, with no increased tax burden for residents and no referendum dollars being spent on the project.



# News & Obituaries Local taxes relatively low compared with other areas . . . Looking at your 2018 property tax bill

Property taxpayers in Hamilton County will not see any significant increase in their tax bills this year, although tax rates will be up slightly in 11 of the municipalities and townships. Rates will decrease slightly in six other taxing units.

Local taxes remain relatively low compared with other areas of the state thanks in part to the county's huge base of taxable real estate now nearing \$21 billion. The tax base on which property taxes is levied has increased 4.2 percent in the past year due largely to new construction and trending increases of individual tax assessments. Individual statements, going in the mail in April, are a combined total of the tax bill for cities, towns, townships, libraries, schools and the county government. Taxes are due May 10 and Nov. 12.

Property taxes do not cover the entire cost of public services. In all taxing entities except schools, a one percent County Income Tax also funds a significant portion of local government spending. Schools receive a distribution of state tax revenue for the major portion of their cost of operation.

Among the county taxing units, Sheridan has the highest tax rate of \$3.21 per hundred dollars of assessed value while unincorporated White River Township has the lowest at \$1.50.

Deputy Auditor Lee Graham, who calculates the rates, notes that slight increases in the overall rate for Jackson Township, Arcadia, Atlanta and Cicero come because of Hamilton North Library improvements, and the higher Clay Township rate is due to a fire rate increase.

The table at right lists the tax rates paid in 2017 compared with new 2018 rates rounded to the nearest penny.

The figures are overall tax rates for the various districts. A complete breakdown of separate portions of the rates in each municipality, township, library district, school and county is found in a legal notice on Page A12 in this edition of the Hamilton County Reporter.

# The thrill and the agony

It's been an exhausting two weeks. My attention has been on the Olympics.

It's not just staying up late for just one more skate, one more jump or one more race. It's finding myself, emotionally, in the midst of so many



events with athletes daring to go where few have ever been or attempted to go. My emotions and my body need a nap.

I do my best to help them. Cheering. Holding my breath. Cringing. Clasping my hands over my heart. It wears on my nerves and my emotions.

I have no idea what exactly a salchow (yes, I looked up the spelling) is in skating but it takes my breath away. A lutz. Really? Whoever thought, "Let's see if I can jump backward from the outside of a skate, turn in the air and land on the outside of the other skate?" Easy peasy. No way.

A skater goes into gold position and then gets beat by a gazillionth of a second. My heart hurts for them. So many years of practices and sacrifices only to get a silver medal.

Come on, it is SILVER, second best in the world. They have reached the pinnacle of their lifetime. It's a tug of war in their mind and heart. I know they are thinking and feeling, "Yes, I'm here but I wanted to be the best of the best. I get it but I want to hug them and tell them that we are proud of them. To reach the thrill of competing in the Olympics is something few athletes will find themselves doing. Most will go home without a medal but look where they were competing. THE Olympics.

I walk across the ice in my boots with traction and I do a twirly and my landing is definitely not a 10. I fear falling and breaking something that at my age cannot be replaced. They have fallen time and time again and know they will fall again and possibly break something. Yet they persevere.

Two skaters during the couple's skate are like free birds on the ice until their skates accidentally collide and they fall but must get up and continue to skate. You know they are feeling sick but they have to finish the skate with knowing they have failed to do what they have succeeded in doing time and time again. Only this time it really mattered.

A skater has a costume malfunction and she not only has to worry about her landing after a triple jump but she has to worry about not exposing the world to more than her ability to skate.

A snowboarder flies and flips, angling to left then right and then lands the tip of his board onto the edge of the snow and crashes. He had spent so many years training. So many perfect landings until the one that counted the most. And he did not stick the landing. The speed skating where it looks like a NASCAR race on ice is mesmerizing. How do they keep up on who is where and not running into another skater? I get confused when they talk sleds. Bobsled. Luge. Skeleton. A bobsled has both steering and brakes. The other two have neither. The lingo of snowboarding is truly an entire language of its own. I just say, "Wow, he/she did really good, whatever they just did." I cannot imagine the pressure these athletes feel. They are representing their families and their country. Families that sacrificed so much. Some can come back in four years, others are one and done. The camera zooms in on a mom of a downhill skier. She watches with her hands covering her mouth. Her eyes tell a story of their own. In the next few moments, her child races down the hill. At the bottom will be the thrill of victory or the agony of defeat. So many hopes and dreams have led them to this moment. One moment in time to make history for the good or for the, well, not so good. How these athletes figure out how to get their bodies to contort to the angles they do, at the speed they do and in conjunction with the partners they do it with, just amazes me. I know it's a lifestyle for these athletes. It's their passion. Kudos to them and their parents. The emotions are raw and run the gamut of feelings. I feel a few of those feelings while curled up under the warm covers. I just know I need to rest up for the Summer Olympics in two years. Whew! I need a long winter's nap.

National Center for Missing & Exploited Children.

Globally, estimates show that 4.5 million people have been trapped in human sex trafficking, according to the International Labor Organization.

Angela Khan, a Carmel-based philanthropist and owner of Sofi B. Luxury Rentals, decided to be a paid sponsor for this event because of her own con-

issue. She said her mother ran away from home and was caught up in the world of human sex trafficking. She said people are often surprised when she tells her story

— which she only recently became comfortable sharing — but she said it's important to raise awareness about this issue.

"Restored Inc. is an angelic group of compassionate, well-trained individuals who know how to treat victims of sex trafficking," Khan said. "Without these kinds of organizations, girls left untreated will turn to drugs and alcohol and suicide. Restored educates families to know the signs so that if you do see something, you can say something and know where to go for help."





# **Carmel dominates with state-record 417 points**

Huskies' Holder 3rd in backstroke - Stallworth, Haflich, Kenney get multiple medals

Five Hamilton County boys swim teams finished in the top 20 in the 2018 IHSAA state championship competition Saturday, Feb. 24, at the IU Natatorium in Indianapolis, but none did better than the Carmel Greyhounds, who captured their 18th Indiana boys state title.

"It's an amazing day to win as many events as we did, it was a strong performance by these guys," Carmel coach Chris Plumb. "We won some really close races, and I think they really rallied for each other."

The last swim of the day summed up the event as Drew Kibler, Wyatt Davis, Brett Sherman, and Jacob Mitchell of Carmel separated from the field and won the 400 freestyle relay by five seconds with a time of 2:59.96. It was a full nine seconds faster than the Greyhounds preliminary time the previous day.

While Carmel played possum on its way to smashing the competition with a state-record 417 points, Fishers, Westfield, Hamilton Southeastern, and Hamilton Heights made strong showings, finishing eighth, tied for 13th, 15th and 20th respectively.

"The kids came back from Friday more comfortable and more relaxed and the back half of the meet they just started getting better," Fishers coach Joe Keller said.

Fishers Drake Stallworth powered the Tigers to their eighth-place finish by qualifying for two individual events and two team events. The junior grabbed a fifth place in the butterfly and sixth in the 200 yard freestyle.

"I had really big goals for state, I didn't reach them, but I think I swam really well," Stallworth said. "Friday was more about getting the times, today was more about racing and putting your hand on the wall, and I thought I did pretty well. I'm happy."

Teammate Cole Van Devender was the top placing Tiger for the day with a thirdplace finish in the one-meter dive.

"He is a talented kid, he is going to dive for IU next year, we had a challenging season for him as far as diving coaching goes," Keller said.

Fishers' Kyle Haflich also had two top eight finishes, placing seventh in the individual medley and eighth in the backstroke.

First, Noblesville broke the 100-point barrier for the first time since 2014. The Millers scored 100.375 points, placing them fifth in the sectional. McCutcheon won with 107.45, followed by Northwestern and Harrison; those three teams advance to next Saturday's regional at Valparaiso.

Noblesville will have someone at Valpo, too. Freshman Makayla Kauzlick placed sixth in both the balance beam and the vault, which qualified her for the regional in both individual events. It's the first time since 2014 that the Millers will have representation at the regional level.

It was a satisfying and accomplished day for Noblesville. The Millers had to deal with injuries throughout the season, which seems to be a recurring theme for Noblesville - almost to the point where the came together on Saturday.

"I am so proud as their coach," said Noblesville coach Jody Ramey. The coach said the team had worked to get their injuries rehabilitated, and also "prove that to start the meet," said Ramey. "One of they are still able to meet that 100 mark, which we did today."

The highest score of the day went to Kauzlick on the vault, where she flipped her way to a 9.225. Her beam score was an 8.75, where she performed a solid routine with a "beam stick," meaning no falls from the beam. In the all-around, Kauzlick placed eighth with a score of 35.375.

"I think I did really good," said Kauzlick. "I definitely want to improve on my other events, but I'm very proud of myself."

"She's a freshman, so she has so much potential," said Ramey. "I have high hopes and great potential for her in the future."

Noblesville had its highest team score on the vault with 26.125 points, but the floor exercise was up there, too. The Millers did outstanding on floor with 26.050 points. Kauzlick scored an 8.90, while junior Devyn Palmer scored 8.80.
