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Sharp says sign ordinance violates free political speech . . .

Candidate sues county commissioners

Rick Sharp, a former Carmel Council president and current candidate for an at-large seat on the Hamilton County Council, has filed a lawsuit in Hamilton County Superior Court 3 alleging a new ordinance passed by county commissioners violates his First Amendment right to free political speech.

Earlier this month, Hamilton County

Commissioners unanimously passed an ordinance prohibiting the placement of signs in county-owned public right-of-ways. Commissioners cited public safety as the reason for the ordinance. Commissioners say placing signs in public right-of-ways makes it difficult for motorists to recognize regulatory signs which are necessary for safe travel and often block the vision of motorists

at intersections.

In his complaint Sharp says the commissioners make no showing of any public safety necessity and, even if they could, any alleged public safety concern does not outweigh the United States Constitution's First Amendment right of free political speech enough to allow commissioners to restrict or regulate political speech.

Sharp alleges he would suffer irreparable harm should the court not grant injunctive relief prohibiting the enforcement of the ordinance.

Sharp is asking Judge William Hughes to declare the ordinance void and to award him costs, expenses and attorney fees.

Sharp is represented by Westfield attorney Timothy Stoesz.

Noblesville prevails at fundraiser

Noblesville cuts ribbon at transportation center

Noblesville Schools officially cut the ribbon last Friday on their newly-constructed transportation center at a public dedication event. The new center is located at 19790 Hague Road adjacent to West Middle School and replaces the previous location on Field Drive near Noblesville High School.

"Our former transportation center was built in 1978 when Noblesville Schools served approximately 4,000 students and couldn't provide the space we need today to serve over 10,000 students," said Beth Niedermeyer, superintendent of Noblesville Schools. "Our

new facility significantly increases capacity, providing room we need for our bus fleet, maintenance bays, office management, meeting space, driver parking and storage."

INDOT awards contract to build Strawtown Avenue roundabout, restore bridge on State Road 37

The Indiana Department of Transportation has awarded Beaty Construction Inc. a \$1.6 million contract to build a roundabout at State Road 37 and Strawtown Avenue and begin work on a bridge deck overlay on SR 37 over the White River in

Strawtown, northeast of Noblesville.

The overlay on the SR 37 bridge over the White River will seal the deck against moisture intrusion and deterioration. At the same time, it restores the bridge's driving surface for a smoother, safer ride.

Strawtown Avenue will be closed for up to 90 days. Detour signs will direct traffic around the construction site via Madison Street, SR 37, 216th Street, Victory Chapel Road and Craig Avenue.

SR 37 will be restricted up to 90 days. A temporary traffic signal will be installed

to regulate both directions of traffic sharing one lane in the work zone.

A start date will be announced after a project schedule has been submitted by contractors. Strawtown Avenue and SR 37 will be fully open to traffic in fall 2018.

Second bond financing Geist Park in Fishers gets approval

Last Monday night, the Fishers City Council approved a \$5 million bond to finance the purchase of land for a new city park located on Geist Reservoir's waterfront. The only dissenting vote came from Councilwoman Selina Stoller, who also voted "no" on the bond at the City Council Finance Committee's last meeting.

A \$12 million bond is currently in place, but the eminent domain process has valued the land roughly \$6 million more than the city's offer to purchase the parcel from IMI Incorporated. That required the additional bond to complete the purchase through the state's condemnation process.

Council President Todd Zimmerman allowed public comment before the vote. Former Fishers Town Councilman Mike Colby and former Democratic Council candidate Greg Purvis both spoke against

Carmel cop honored for saving life

On June 20, 2017, Carmel Police Officer Tony Lovitt was on patrol when he received notification from Hamilton County Communications Center dispatcher Jill Jones of an unconscious male in the area of Bayhill Drive and Sugar Cay Court. Officer Lovitt responded and, upon arriving on the scene, he observed a good Samaritan, Bill Schlies, performing CPR on the unconscious male who was later identified as Jeff Utzinger. Officer Lovitt

immediately retrieved his automated external defibrillator (AED) and attached the instrument to Utzinger. The AED delivered one shock to Utzinger. Also arriving at the scene was Sergeant Brady Myers. Myers assisted Schlies and Lovitt by performing chest compressions on Utzinger until Carmel Fire Department personnel arrived. Officer Lovitt was recently honored for his quick and effective response along with Sgt. Myers for

his assistance with chest compressions. The Carmel Police Department stated the officers' quick actions resulted in Utzinger being revived on the scene and transported to the hospital for further care. Following the incident Officer Lovitt maintained contact with a family member and sought updates on Utzinger. Later, Utzinger and his family then met with Lovitt. The meeting was described very emotional as Utzinger thanked

Officer Lovitt for his quick actions that played an integral part in saving his life. Jeff Utzinger is married with three young children and as a result of these first responders they will have their father for many more years. On Feb. 13, Officer Lovitt, Bill Schlies and survivor Jeff Utzinger were recognized by IU Health North and "Bolt for the Heart 5K Run/Walk" AED presentation at the State Fairgrounds Indiana Farm Bureau building.

and bus routes have been running from there since school resumed following winter break. "With almost 200 different routes, our 100+ buses and drivers travel approximately 1.2 million miles each year safely transporting 9,300 students a day to 10 school buildings and locations as far away as Downtown Indy and Beech Grove," added Nie-

dermeyer. "The work they do is an important part of supporting students. We're also proud that our transportation mechanics have had a perfect safety inspection rate for 31 consecutive years." The new transportation center location was chosen because of its accessibility for bus routes and its infrastructure design. It was also a cost savings for the dis-

trict because they already owned the land. The location next to West Middle School will also help address the parking shortage at that school, providing West event visitors additional parking options. The design was crafted with the community in mind, incorporating a maximum set-back off the road and landscaping buffers to address any sight or noise

concerns from neighbors. Traffic impact was explored with the City of Noblesville and the Indiana Department of Transportation with no noted concerns. The \$10.5 million cost of the construction project was financed through construction bonds, with no increased tax burden for residents and no referendum dollars being spent on the project.

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Local taxes relatively low compared with other areas . . .
Looking at your 2018 property tax bill

Property taxpayers in Hamilton County will not see any significant increase in their tax bills this year, although tax rates will be up slightly in 11 of the municipalities and townships. Rates will decrease slightly in six other taxing units.

Local taxes remain relatively low compared with other areas of the state thanks in part to the county’s huge base of taxable real estate now nearing \$21 billion. The tax base on which property taxes is levied has increased 4.2 percent in the past year due largely to new construction and trending increases of individual tax assessments. Individual statements, going in the mail in April, are a combined total of the tax bill for cities, towns, townships, libraries, schools and the county government. Taxes are due May 10 and Nov. 12.

Property taxes do not cover the entire cost of public services. In all taxing entities except schools, a one percent County Income Tax also funds a significant portion of local

government spending. Schools receive a distribution of state tax revenue for the major portion of their cost of operation.

Among the county taxing units, Sheridan has the highest tax rate of \$3.21 per hundred dollars of assessed value while unincorporated White River Township has the lowest at \$1.50.

Deputy Auditor Lee Graham, who calculates the rates, notes that slight increases in the overall rate for Jackson Township, Arcadia, Atlanta and Cicero come because of Hamilton North Library improvements, and the higher Clay Township rate is due to a fire rate increase.

The table at right lists the tax rates paid in 2017 compared with new 2018 rates rounded to the nearest penny.

The figures are overall tax rates for the various districts. A complete breakdown of separate portions of the rates in each municipality, township, library district, school and county is found in a legal notice on Page A12 in this edition of the Hamilton County Reporter.

the bond issue, citing to the possibility of ongoing costs the city may face in the future developing this park.

The council voted unanimously to suspend the rules, allowing a final vote on the bond last Monday. Stoller voted to suspend the rules and allow a final vote, but voted “no” when the bond was up for approval.

In another financial

item, the council voted unanimously to re-establish a Cumulative Capital Development Fund for 2019. City staff told council members this simply conforms current systems to changes in state law. Some local residents apparently were under the impression that passing the establishment of this fund would raise the city tax rate by 5 cents for each \$100 of assessed property valua-

tion. City officials assured those at the session that the mechanism for consideration of such an increase is not changed by this vote and the city has no plans at this time to raise the local property tax rate for this fund.

In one more financial matter, the council unanimously approved a study done by Policy Analytics, an independent firm commissioned by the city, to

conduct a study of data related to the use of Tax Increment Financing (TIF) in economic development. Mayor Scott Fadness plans to present the report to the Hamilton Southeastern School Board next month. You can read the report at bit.ly/2ERLc3U.

Finally, Todd Muth of the Fishers Fire Department was recognized by the council for an Employee Service Award.

It's been an exhausting two weeks. My attention has been on the Olympics.

It's not just staying up late for just one more skate, one more jump or one more race. It's finding myself, emotionally, in the midst of so many events with athletes daring to go where few have ever been or attempted to go. My emotions and my body need a nap.

I do my best to help them. Cheering. Holding my breath. Cringing. Clapping my hands over my heart. It wears on my nerves and my emotions.

I have no idea what exactly a salchow (yes, I looked up the spelling) is in skating but it takes my breath away. A lutz. Really? Whoever thought, "Let's see if I can jump backward from the outside of a skate, turn in the air and land on the outside of the other skate?" Easy peasy. No way.

A skater goes into gold position and then gets beat by a gazillionth of a second. My heart hurts for them. So many years of practices and sacrifices only to get a silver medal.

Come on, it is SILVER, second best in the world. They have reached the pinnacle of their lifetime. It's a tug of war in their mind and heart. I know they are thinking and feeling, "Yes, I'm here but I wanted to be the best of the best. I get it but I want to hug them and tell them that we are proud of them. To reach the thrill of competing in the Olympics is something few athletes will find themselves doing. Most will go home without a medal but look where they were competing. THE Olympics.

I walk across the ice in my boots with traction and I do a twirly and my landing is definitely not a 10. I fear falling and breaking something that at my age cannot be replaced. They have fallen time and time again and know they will fall again and possibly break something. Yet they persevere.

Two skaters during the couple's skate are like free birds on the ice until their skates accidentally collide and they fall but must get up and continue to skate. You know they are feeling sick but they have to finish the skate with knowing they have failed to do what they have succeeded in doing time and time again. Only this time it really mattered.

A skater has a costume malfunction and she not only has to worry about her landing after a triple jump but she has to worry about not exposing the world to more than her ability to skate.

A snowboarder flies and flips, angling to left then right and then lands the tip of his board onto the edge of the snow and crashes. He had spent so many years training. So many perfect landings until the one that counted the most. And he did not stick the landing.

The speed skating where it looks like a NASCAR race on ice is mesmerizing. How do they keep up on who is where and not running into another skater?

I get confused when they talk sleds. Bobsled. Luge. Skeleton. A bobsled has both steering and brakes. The other two have neither.

The lingo of snowboarding is truly an entire language of its own. I just say, "Wow, he/she did really good, whatever they just did."

I cannot imagine the pressure these athletes feel. They are representing their families and their country. Families that sacrificed so much. Some can come back in four years, others are one and done.

The camera zooms in on a mom of a downhill skier. She watches with her hands covering her mouth. Her eyes tell a story of their own. In the next few moments, her child races down the hill. At the bottom will be the thrill of victory or the agony of defeat. So many hopes and dreams have led them to this moment. One moment in time to make history for the good or for the, well, not so good.

How these athletes figure out how to get their bodies to contort to the angles they do, at the speed they do and in conjunction with the partners they do it with, just amazes me.

I know it's a lifestyle for these athletes. It's their passion. Kudos to them and their parents. The emotions are raw and run the gamut of feelings. I feel a few of those feelings while curled up under the warm covers.

I just know I need to rest up for the Summer Olympics in two years. Whew! I need a long winter's nap.

Westfield Police Department did not respond to The Reporter's request for comment.

On Tuesday, Carmel Po-

lice Department and Carmel Clay School's security plans remained in place with an increased police presence in and around Carmel High School. However, all evidence supports these social media threats were fabricated by both juveniles and they had no means to carry out the threats.

In a statement, Carmel

Police say they are following up on further leads regarding the investigation. Police and school officials thanked the public for their patience and understanding throughout the lengthy investigation. Carmel Police spokesperson, Joe Bickell stated, "As a collaborative effort, safety and security in our schools is a top priority and concern."

Donatello's in Carmel will hold fundraiser to fight human trafficking

Donatello's Italian Restaurant in Carmel is hosting a fundraiser for Restored, Inc., an Indianapolis-based nonprofit that addresses human sex trafficking throughout the state.

The event, called "Springtime in Italy: A Time for Renewal," is a four-course wine dinner at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, April 24. Tickets cost \$75, which includes a charitable donation but not tax or tip. They can be purchased at 9 W. Main St., Carmel or on-line at donatellosrestored.eventbrite.com.

Restored helps raise awareness and provide education and advocacy on the issue of human sex trafficking. In addition,

victim services are offered, such as emergency housing referrals, trauma counseling, court advocacy, food and clothing, medical help and more.

"We are thankful for Donatello's putting together such a great event for Restored," said Jim Eibel, a Carmel resident and member of Restored's board of directors. "We are also thankful for those who will sit down with us and enjoy an amazing dining experience while taking a stand against human trafficking."

Hamilton County hasn't been immune to cases of human trafficking. For instance, in 2016 authorities identified nine young girls from Hamilton County who were purchased by

adults for sex. The youngest girl was 11 years old.

Nationally, 1 in 6 endangered runaways reported that they were likely sex trafficking victims, according to a 2016 report by the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children.

Globally, estimates show that 4.5 million people have been trapped in human sex trafficking, according to the International Labor Organization.

Angela Khan, a Carmel-based philanthropist and owner of Sofi B. Luxury Rentals, decided to be a paid sponsor for this event because of her own con-

nection to this issue. She said her mother ran away from home and was caught up in the world of human sex trafficking. She said people are often surprised when she tells her story — which she only recently became comfortable sharing — but she said it's important to raise awareness about this issue.

"Restored Inc. is an angelic group of compassionate, well-trained individuals who know how to treat victims of sex trafficking," Khan said. "Without these kinds of organizations, girls left untreated will turn to drugs and alcohol and

too often the end result is suicide. Restored educates families to know the signs so that if you do see something, you can say something and know where to go for help."

Hamilton County Sgt. Bill Clifford, a candidate for county sheriff, also has decided to be a paid sponsor for this charity fundraiser.

"Human trafficking is a failure of humanity where the worst of society prey on the weak for a profit," Clifford said. "Law enforcement at all levels needs to be trained to identify warning signs and cooperate fully to eliminate the problem. Those most susceptible to human trafficking need to know there are better op-

tions and seek help and protection through the government or faith-based organizations."

"We are so thankful for everyone who has decided to support this important cause," Aasen said. "I personally visited Restored's offices and spoke to their staff and I can attest that these selfless servants are truly doing God's work as they work tirelessly to both help victims and prevent future human trafficking cases. I just can't say enough about the good work they do."

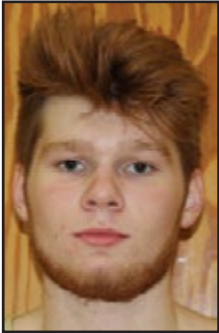
Keever-Hill pulled eight rebounds for the game, with Barnes collecting seven.

Uncharacteristically his team was outrebounded 34-25 by the Tribe, making the turnover statistic look paramount in the outcome of the game. Smith praised point guard Clay Hepp and Sills for their decision-making with the basketball. Anderson committed 15 turnovers, including five in the

Guerin Catholic finishes 15-8 on the regular season. The Golden Eagles return to Class 3A play this season after two seasons of playing in the IHSAA's 4A state tournament. CGHS will host Sectional 27 this season, and consequently will host Circle City Conference rival Bishop Chatard at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 27 as its seven-team sectional gets underway.

Guerin Catholic played the Trojans on Jan. 5 and won easily, 69-47.

"We've had good luck against Chatard, and that first game was two months ago," said Smith. "I share with our guys a statistic I saw last year on John Harrell's website. When teams play a second time in sectionals, a team that lost the first match-up has won the rematch more often than not."

Huskies drop high-scoring game

The Hamilton Heights-Harrison game that took place at the Raiders' gym on Tuesday, Feb. 20 could be described in one word: Fast.

Both teams scored early, late and often. In the end, Harrison beat the Huskies 89-76 in their regular-season finale.

"It will be Indiana high school basketball at its best in the world's largest and finest high school gym. We are going to have some fun and let it all out."

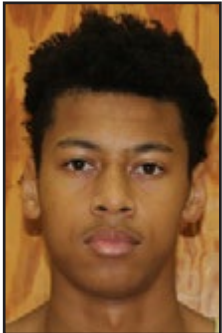

Five Hamilton County boys swim teams finished in the top 20 in the 2018 IHSAA state championship competition Saturday, Feb. 24, at the IU Natatorium in Indianapolis, but none did better than the Carmel Greyhounds, who captured their 18th Indiana boys state title.

The last swim of the day summed up the event as Drew Kibler, Wyatt Davis, Brett Sherman, and Jacob Mitchell of Carmel separated from the field and won the 400 freestyle relay by five seconds with a time of 2:59.96. It was a full nine seconds faster than the Greyhounds preliminary time the previous day.

While Carmel played possum on its way to smashing the competition with a state-record 417 points, Fishers, Westfield, Hamilton Southeastern, and Hamilton Heights made strong showings, finishing eighth, tied for 13th, 15th and 20th respectively.

“The kids came back from Friday more comfortable and more relaxed and the back half of the meet they just started getting better,” Fishers coach Joe Keller said.

Fishers Drake Stallworth powered the Tigers to their eighth-place finish by qualifying for two individual events and two team events. The junior grabbed a fifth place in the butterfly and sixth in the 200 yard freestyle.

“I had really big goals for state, I didn’t reach them, but I think I swam really well,” Stallworth said. “Friday was more about getting the times, today was more about racing and putting your hand on the wall, and I thought I did pretty well. I’m happy.”

Teammate Cole Van Devender was the top placing Tiger for the day with a third-place finish in the one-meter dive.

“He is a talented kid, he is going to dive for IU next year, we had a challenging season for him as far as diving coaching goes,” Keller said.

Fishers’ Kyle Haflich also had two top eight finishes, placing seventh in the individual medley and eighth in the backstroke.

But this event, like so many Indiana swimming state championships of late, belonged to the Greyhounds. Carmel swimmers were everywhere and typically ended near the top, as second-place finishing Franklin Community lagged far behind totaling 203 points. Zionsville rounded out the top three with 185 points.

Drew Kibler, one of the top high school swimmers in the nation, led the Greyhounds with two individual wins and two team wins. His time of 19.38 in the 50 freestyle preliminaries set a USA record, held previously by Florida’s Ryan Murphy from 2012. He won the championship in that event on Saturday in a time of 19.50 seconds. The senior nabbed his second 2018 individual state championship in the butterfly with a 47.16 and aided Carmel’s first-place finish in the 200 medley relay.

Kibler got plenty of backup, particularly from Wyatt Davis and Stefano Batista, who both contributed to multiple first-place finishes for Carmel. Davis may have outdone Kibler by making himself a state champion in two individual events, the 200 yard individual medley and the backstroke, as well as two team events.

“We work hard and stay humble and with these guys around you, you know they are going to do their part and be there for you,” Carmel’s Wyatt Davis said.

Batista became a two-time state champion for Carmel, finishing first in the

breaststroke with a time of 54.74 and helping the Greyhounds take the 200-yard medley relay. Carmel, which won nine of 12 events, got a one-two finish in the 500-yard freestyle from first and second place finishers Jacob Mitchell and Brett Sherman.

“I’ve been working for this for a long time and I think this team came together. And we are never satisfied, and I think the shows that hard work pays off,” Carmel swimmer Stefano Batista said.

HOLDER, KENNEY GET MEDALS

Heights junior Jared Holder was responsible for all 23 of the Huskies’ points. Holder placed third in the backstroke in a time of 49.99 seconds, the second time this season he swam the event under 50 seconds.

Holder, as a result, earned the first state swimming medal for the Huskies since Jake Wood placed eighth in the breaststroke at the 2011 state meet. Holder also placed 10th in the 50 free, in a time of 21.10 seconds.

Westfield senior Chris Kenney picked

up two medals. Kenney finished fifth in the 100 free in 46.06 seconds, and took sixth in the 50 free in 21.02 seconds. The senior also swam on both the 200 and 400 freestyle relays, which both placed 14th.

HSE WINS MEDLEY CONSOLATION

Hamilton Southeastern’s state finals started with a win in the consolation heat of the medley relay. The team of junior Blake Ratliff and sophomores Andrew Truxall, Connor Harrison and Andrew Christopher swam the race in 1:35.21, officially placing ninth. The Royals also had three other races in the consolation heat, while junior diver Thomas Barr took 12th in the finals of that event.

MILLERS’ WOLFRED MOVES UP

Noblesville junior Jack Wolfred represented himself and the Millers well at state, as he swam in the consolation heat of the 100 free.

Wolfred placed 12th with a time of 46.93 seconds. The junior was seeded 16th, so he moved up four places. Wolfred scored five points, which tied Noblesville for 37th in the team standings.
