HSE School Board moves forward on Community Health contract

munity Health will become a much larger presence in the Ham-

ilton Southeastern School District following the passage of a resolution empowering school administrators to finalize a contract with the health network. Community already provides mental health services, but will now staff the employee health center and eventually employ nurses working in the district's school buildings.

IU Health canceled its pact with HSE Schools to provide an employee health center on 90 days' notice, meaning their clinic will close as of Sept. 2. Community Health has committed to making every effort to open its health clinic by Sept. 2, but if that cannot be done, HSE School workers will be di-

rected to other Community Health facilities in the area. Community had expected to open the health Center Jan. 1, 2019, but the IU cancellation created a need to speed up the process.

Marianne Lawson Vogt spoke on behalf of the nursing staff in HSE Schools. "While we can't say we are not disappointed to be leaving as HSE employees," Vogt told the board, "We would like to thank the board, especially

Michelle Fullhart and Svlvia Shepler."

Vogt says this has been "very long and hard process, and we believe we've all made the best of the current vote before the board. There's always compromise and balancing, saving funds in our students' best interest."

Part of the compromise will expand the types of medications nurses may dispense in their schools, greatly expanding the list from what Community Health had originally proposed. This changeover of nurses becoming Community Health employees will not happen until the 2019-2020 school year.

In a related action, Methodist Health will continue to provide sports training services to HSE Schools, in the 2018-2019 school year, but Community Health will take that program over in the 2019-2020 year.

ITM ordered to vacate Forest Park immediately

Hamilton County Judge Paul Felix has issued a decision on a court battle involving the Indiana Transportation Museum (ITM) and the City of Noblesville's decision not to renew the museum's lease at Forest Park.

As a part of the case, ITM had asked the court to issue a restraining order blocking a June 1, 2018 date established by Noblesville for the museum to vacate the property.

In late May, Felix conducted a hearing on the matter. Last Thursday, Felix issued a ruling requiring ITM to immediately vacate Forest Park.

Felix's ruling stated:

• The ITM is to immediately vacate the property.

· That any structures, additions, equipment or property remaining on the premises will be deemed abandoned if not removed by July 12, 2018.

• After July 12, 2018, Noblesville will be granted possession of the premises and is authorized to change the locks on the property.

The 13-year-old boy who prosecutors allege last month shot his teacher and a fellow student at Noblesville West Middle School has had his trial in juvenile court pushed back to September at the request of his attorneys.

were Two people wounded in the shooting, teacher Jason Seaman and 13-year-old student Ella Whistler. Seaman sustained minor injuries and was

hailed as a hero for his role in interrupting the suspect from hurting even more students. Seaman was released from the hospital in the days that followed the shooting. Whistler was critically injured and has remained hospitalized since the shooting.

The announcement on Wednesday came after a previously scheduled court date this week was postponed to allow the defense more time to prepare for the case.

Felony charge filed in Fishers IKEA incident

Last Monday, Fishers police responded to the Fishers IKEA store, located near 116th Street and Interstate 69, to investigate a report of an accidental discharge of a firearm. Upon their arrival officers located and identified the individuals involved in the incident. Officers obtained statements from the gun owner, the juvenile's guardian and bystanders.

According to their statements and evidence located at the scene, the owner of the gun, Francis T. Wright, 62, Camby, was sitting on a couch inside the store. When Wright stood up the gun fell into the couch. He walked away leaving the gun behind.

A short time later two boys, both 6 years of age, sat down on the couch.

One of the boys handled the gun, causing it to accidentally discharge one time. No one was injured during this incident.

The police department submitted the case to the Hamilton County Prosecuting Attorney's Office. After conducting a full review, Hamilton County Prosecutor Lee Buckingham filed a felony criminal charge of Criminal Recklessness With A Deadly Weapon against Wright.

The Fishers Police Department would like to thank the Hamilton County Prosecuting Attorney's Office for their partnership as police reassure the community with a strong message: Possessing a gun requires a great deal of responsibility. When a person does not take their responsibility seriously, there will be consequences.

Sheriff deputy, Cicero officer charged in prank call case


A Hamilton County sheriff's deputy and a Cicero police officer are due in court next week after admitting to investigators that the pair had been drinking during a party on May 1 and making two prank phone calls to the Hamilton County 911 dispatch center.

In an affidavit filed by a Hamilton County sheriff's investigator, Deputy David Needham is alleged to have made the first call when he attempted to disguise his voice to sound like a female, "Jessica," who called 911 to report that her boyfriend was stalking her at the time. Needham, sounding like "Jessica," reported that her boyfriend had left the location and fled on foot before ending the call without providing any ther information.

Bradley Gorgas, an officer with the Cicero Police Department, made the second prank call at approximately 1:55 a.m., just minutes after Needham's prank call. Gorgas told the 911 dispatcher about a fight involving 10 people at the Speedway gas station in Cicero. Gorgas said that he was scared and that officers needed to arrive quickly before ending the call. Responding officers found no evidence of a fight at the gas station.

Investigators interviewed both men at different times in the weeks following the calls and each man admitted to having been drinking during a party at Gorgas' house on May 1 and confessed that they were aware that they were making prank phone calls.

Both are due in court for their initial hearings on July 11.

Reising is an aviation enthusiast and has been pouring much time and energy into attaining his pilot's license. Because of his cerebral palsy, there have been many curvy roads to get there, but he is determined to achieve his goals, no matter how long it takes. Eagle Scout Neil Armstrong has always been his idol and a driving force for his quest

From the beginning of the discussions about his Eagle Scout Project, Reising was focused on creating a walking trail on his church property, Bethel Lutheran Church in Noblesville. His youth group leader, Joe Rudy, was supportive of his idea from the start, and along with Kirk Pfeil, another church member, they collectively narrowed his plan down, slightly.

His Troop Committee didn't feel as strongly about his project because the scope was so large, but after some discussion and a promise by Reising to phase the project, the Bethel Peace Trail was born.

Reising was able to raise over \$10,000 worth of goods, services and money to commit to the entire 0.4-mile stone trail. It took moving 400 tons of dirt, 400 tons of crushed limestone and nearly 500 volunteer hours to complete the project. 



We are very pleased with the court's order and believe it is the right ruling and in the public's best interest. The property is a mess but will be restored in a safe and efficient manner. The city will continue to hold ITM responsible for any environmental issues remaining at the site."


