



Hamilton County Health Dept. confirms 1st case of coronavirus

On Sunday, the Hamilton County Health Department, in consultation with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Health Department will (CDC) and Indiana State Department of Health (ISDH), confirmed the first case of novel coronavirus in a Hamilton County resident. The patient is currently hospitalized.

In a statement issued to the media, the Hamilton County Health Department stated they would not provide further information Officer Dr. Charles Harabout the person or identify ris said, "We have known the hospital.

The county is working closely with the state health department to identify any close contacts of the patient who might have been exposed to ensure that appropriate precautions are taken in accordance with the latest

At the Sheridan Public Library Board meeting last Monday, an agreement was reached between the library and Marion Township Trustee Mike Morgan to provide library services to students in Sheridan Community Schools (SCS) who reside in Marion Township in Boone County.

The library will make its system available for SCS students living in Marion Township in the same manner and to the same extent as if they were residents or real property taxpayers of its library district by making use of subscription cards. The township will pay the Sheridan Public Library a fee of \$1,000 per year.

Student cards are only to be used by the student. Additional cards may be purchased at the expense of the township resident or real property taxpayer.

out of love all the time. Although, in some situations, divorce does not solve all the problems ... especially if you have kids.



Fishers moves forward on 5G with limited legal authority

The City of Fishers will move forward with permit requests for 5G towers in residential neighborhoods using all the legal levers at its disposal, but the mayor and city attorney caution local residents that the state and federal governments have usurped most of the authority to regulate 5G technology.

City Attorney Chris Greisl told the Board of Pub-Fishers can look at where

towers are located within a neighborhood, but cannot ban or deny all requests for 5G small cell towers based on state and federal law.

Mayor Scott Fadness said the city will notify homeowners associations (HOAs) when tower permits are under consideration, and will also notify all residents within 200 feet of the proposed pole. Fishers to fund neighborhood matching grants again this year

The City of Fishers will provide nearly \$68,000 in funding for matching grants to Fishers neighborhoods this year. The grants were once separated into the Neighborhood Matching Grant and the Tree Matching Grant, but have renamed the Vibrant Neighborhoods Matching Grant (VNMG).

According to the city, the intent of the VNMG program is to provide mon-

ey for older neighborhoods, typically 10 years or older. Projects funded include beautification of a subdivision entrance or property along city roadways.

Over \$78,000 total was requested by 22 neighborhoods throughout Fishers. A committee reviewed all requests and submitted its recommendations to the Board of Public Works and Safety, which voted to approve the committee's work at its Monday meeting. The funds had been approved by the City Council as part of the 2020 budget.







Boys basketball tournament postponed

It was one of the last sports standing after the wave of cancellations due to the coronavirus outbreak.

But last Friday, the IHSAA announced that the boys basketball tournament would be postponed. The tournament was supposed to play its regional games today, but those have now been pushed back

Shortly after noon, the IHSAA released the following statement: "Due to the number of schools closing after today for an extended period of time, it has become apparent the IHSAA boys basketball tournament series cannot be completed as scheduled. Subsequently, the boys basketball tournament is postponed immediately."

Carmel was to play in the Logansport regional last Saturday, taking on New Haven in the second semi-final game. That contest would have followed the first semi-final between Marion and Fort Wayne Snider.

"This time in our society is unprecedented," said Carmel athletic director Jim Inskeep. "I appreciate the efforts of the IHSAA to make accommodations but at the end of the day sometimes things just don't work. I think everyone is taking the proper precautions for the greater good of our state and nation."

The IHSAA had already tried to accommodate the quickly-changing situation. Last Thursday, the organization announced that regional games would be played but with limited spectators. That was still the plan as of last Friday morning before the IHSAA made the decision to postpone the tournament.

Commissioner Bobby Cox said last Friday night on the Indiana Sports Talk radio show that it was "impossible to tell people that the boys basketball tournament will continue on a specific date." The boys basketball tournament has been played to completion every year since the inaugural event in 1911, and has never once been canceled or ended before the state finals.


